The History Of Fierorama

2015 marks the 20th edition of Fierorama which began in 1996

Fierorama was conceived at the 1995 NIFE Christmas party at the home of former NIFE Club Member Frank Owen. A simple discussion took place that our club should host our own car show.

Through subsequent meetings of the NIFE Board, Paul Vargyas suggested we call our show "Fierorama" named after GM's "Motorama" shows of the 1950's; and so it came to be!

Fierorama was originally designed as an honor to the daily driven Fiero. Our first intention was to see just how many Fieros we could get in one place on one day. The goal of Fierorama is not to award the most pristine, showroom new, trailered Fieros. Rather, our goal is to reward the owners who do not consider their Fiero a show car because they use it everyday and find it difficult to keep it in showroom condition. Ideally, we preferred to reward the best-looking Fiero with the most amount of miles on it. The Fierorama classes are broken down by body style and, more importantly, mileage so that cars are competing in classes together that have similar wear and tear. As Fiero owners continue to enjoy driving their cars, each year we adjust the class mileage descriptions to reflect continued usage.

• Fierorama 1996 & 1997 took place at the Chestnut Court Shopping Center located at 75th Street and Lemont Road in Darien, IL (we were looking for a highly visible location to attract a crowd of on-lookers). The Home Run Inn Pizza restaurant provided our food service and rest room needs.









• Fierorama 1998 thru 2005 took place in Oak Brook, IL in an office parking lot just north of 22nd Street on Midwest Road. At the time, the Cruisin' Tigers GTO Club was hosting their Indian Uprising All Pontiac Car Show at this same location. The McDonald's at the south edge of the parking lot provided our food service and restroom needs.









• From 2006 thru 2009, Fierorama took place at Pottawatomie Park along the Fox River in St. Charles, IL. Former NIFE Member Vince Badali had a contact on the St. Charles Park District's Board Of Directors to help get us into this location.



• In 2010 and 2011, Fierorama took place in the parking lot of the Holiday Inn Express in St. Charles, IL due to pool construction at Pottawatomie Park.





- Based on an average of 40 volunteers used to help execute each Fierorama, we have had over 760 volunteers over the past 19 shows! Thank you to all of our volunteers!
- The Fierorama class with the highest participation was class H (Modified Class more than six viewable modifications & all major engine conversions) in 2002 with 25 cars!

- The only Fierorama where Jim could not fall asleep the night before the show!
- The only Fierorama that Rodney Dickman participated in with his '88 Mera!
- Rich Warber's last Fierorama before the mind-boggling Fiero chop top made its debut!
- A member wrote on their comment card that was mailed in after the show that, "We need to keep this a free event for club members!"
- Another member wrote, "Keep Fierorama for daily driven Fieros, not show cars!"
- The only Fierorama to take place in the month of June.

- Rich Warber's Fiero chop top made it debut! It was selected as the People's Choice winner!
- Five blue Fiero GT Fastbacks were in attendance!
- Fierorama has always been FREE to NIFE Members; non-members are only charged a \$10.00 entry fee.

- NIFE Club Member Mel Johnson videotaped the show for us. In the President's Message of Fiero Focus, Jim wrote, "If you would like a copy of the video, please send an empty VHS video tape and we will arrange to make a copy for you."
- This is the first Fierorama to have a dash plaque; it replaced the $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" commemorative color poster.

- This year was the first year without NIFE Club Member Rich Warber who passed away on 8-16-99 after a ninemonth battle with cancer. Rich, of course, was the originator of the Fiero chop top.
- This year was the first year to have a Fiero with a Cadillac Northstar engine conversion. This Fiero was owned by Chris Moore of Auburn, IN. Chris' Fiero won the People's Choice Award, the Ronald McDonald's Choice Award and the Best Of Class for Custom/Rebody.
- This year was the first year we assigned designated hours for the Registration table and Club Display table.
- This year was the first year with a DJ to provide background music and announcements. Thanks to NIFE Club Member Elmer Schild.

• The words "Viewable Modifications" were coined as a way to help us differentiate the Fierorama classes.

• Our highest mileage Fiero participating topped 305,000 miles. It was owned by NIFE Club Member Al Wagner with an original owner '84 which had the original engine.

• This was the first year we broadcast a live webcast from the show field.

- This was Nick DiMonte's first Fierorama
- This year was the first and only year so far that we created Fierorama special events license plates for Illinois residents.



• "Park 4 Fun" class debuts. If you cannot commit to attending the entire day's festivities, you can come for as long as you want and enter the Park 4 Fun class. This class will not be judged; simply park your Fiero and leave when you must! We want all NIFE members to be able to participate in the Fierorama experience, even if you can only stop by for an hour or two to take in as much as you can.

• This year was the debut of the Fierorama Tech Tables to help club members learn more about their Fieros by interacting with club member "technical experts".

• This year we started an award for the lowest VIN# and the highest VIN# representing the "oldest" Fiero and the "youngest" Fieros on the show field.

- 2003 actual trophies were used for the first time. The trophies were donated by NIFE Club Member Chris Berry.
- 2010 The Best Of Show awards were engraved aluminum license plates created by Chuck Itzenthaler.
- 2012 trophies were desk clocks
- 2014 An '80's theme! Trophies featured a Hot Wheels Fiero, an image of the Hall & Oates concert promotion poster featuring the Fiero, a Rubic's cube, a cassette tape all mounted to a VCR tape.

- 1996 "In Honor Of The Daily Driven Fiero"
- 2004 Wayne Dzien (Dr. Detail) wrote in the Fierorama review that appeared in Fiero Focus, "Approximately 25% of Fierorama this year was made up of unique show cars: the custom and modified fieros; and the ever growing group of rebodies. This is a radical departure from, "The Daily Driven Fiero". In the years to come, I would like to predict that as much as 40% of future Fieroramas will be made up of these exploding classes".

- 2006 "Rollin' On The River"
- 2007 "Fieros On The Fox"
- 2008 "Lucky 13" a poker/Las Vegas theme with fuzzy dice and Fierorama tokens.

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

'96 Fierorama Highlights

- Event date was June 23, 1996
- Fierorama is designed to have the highest quantity of Fieros, not the highest quality. Thus, the tag line, "In Honor Of The Daily Driven Fiero"
- There were no metal dash plaques. Each participant received an 8-1/2" x 11" commemorative poster designed by former NIFE Member Byron Daugherty

- V8 Archie's GT4T Fiero rebody debuted.














'05 Fierorama Highlights

- Larry Highes drove 2,422 miles from San Diego, California to attend this year's event.














